Anti-CAA protests continue across India

At least six dead in UP; thousands rally in New Delhi

NEW DELHI, DEC 20 (PTI) At least six persons died as violent clashes with police rocked Uttar Pradesh on Friday while thousands rallied in the national capital and several other cities with tricolour and 'Save Constitution' banners as part of raging protests across states against the amended citizenship law and the proposed NRC, prompting the government to indicate it was ready to accept suggestions.

A car was set on fire in Delhi's Daryaganj area and protesters hurled stones at security personnel near Delhi Gate, while police used water cannons and lathi-charge a large group of protesters to disperse the crowd. Sporadic violence was reported from other parts of Delhi, Maharashtra and Karnataka-Kerala border areas as well, while authorities resorted to curbs on mobile internet and SMS services in various regions, including in parts of UP, Karnataka and the national

capital. Some groups, however, offered roads to the police to underline peaceful nature of the protest. Heavy security was deployed in all sensitive areas, including those where large-scale protests took place on Thursday that saw at least three deaths including of two persons in police firing in Mangaluru. One person had died in Lucknow. Taking the nationwide toll to at least nine in two days, six protesters were killed during protests at various places in Uttar Pradesh. The raging protests also saw some allies of the ruling BJP voicing their concerns. Bihar Chief Minister and JDU leader Nitish Kumar asserted the NRC will not be imple-

mented in his state, while another BJP ally JLP's president Chirag Paswan said the protests show the central government has "failed" to dispel confusion among a disaffected section of society. The national capital remained heavily barricaded but prohibitory orders and closure of several metro stations could not stop thousands from rallying near Jama Masjid area, soon after Friday afternoon prayers.

However, it was UP that saw violent clashes breaking out at multiple places, including in Gorakhpur, Sambhal, Bhadohi, Bahraich, Farrukhabad, Bulandshahr and Firozabad, soon after Friday prayers as protesters hurled stones, torched vehicles and faced police action. In Gujarat, a mob pelted stones at the police outside a mosque in communally sensitive Hathikhama area of Vadodra city, objecting to video-shooting of namaz congregation, which the officials said was being done as a preventive measure in the wake of anti-CAA protests. In Maharashtra, mobs pelted stones at state transport buses in Beed, Nanded and Pathanashir districts, while over 10,000 took part in a protest march in Pune.

In Kerala, police kept high vigil in northern districts in the wake of the killing of two persons in Mangaluru in neighbouring Karnataka.

NITI Aayog to draft plan for 'population stabilisation'

NEW DELHI, DEC 20 (AGENCIES): NITI Aayog will soon start drafting a roadmap for "population stabilisation" in India. On Friday, it organised a national consultation titled "Realising the vision of population stabilisation: leaving no one behind" with the Population Foundation of India (PFI) in Delhi.

"The consultative meeting (with PFI)... will bring together senior officials, experts and specialists to discuss ways and means of strengthening population policy and family planning programmes," said an official statement. Aayog hopes that it will be able to include recommendations from the meeting in the working paper on population stabilisation it will soon release. "The working paper is expected to address key gaps in family planning programmes. It will offer constructive recommendations to address regional disparities in outcomes by focusing on adolescents and youths, inter-departmental convergence, demand generation, access to contraceptive services and quality of care," it said.

Kenye resigns as NPF secretary general

KOHIMA, DEC 20 (NPN): A day after show-cause notice was served to him by NPF Disciplinary Action Committee (DAC) for voting in favour of the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill in Parliament, party's secretary general and Rajya Sabha member, KG Kenye tendered his resignation from the party's post on Friday.

Announcing this at a press conference at Japfu Hotel here, Kenye explained that it was a matter of prestige and image within his party, and hence he had tendered his resignation from the post. But, he added that he had not resigned from the party. However, before he had received the show-cause notice, the MP informed the media persons that he had made several attempts to meet NPF president Dr Shurhozelie Liezietsu to explain why he had voted in favour of CAB 2019, but claimed that latter did not give him a chance to meet and explain the matter to him. In a letter addressed to the NPF president, Kenye stated that in the face of being served the show-cause

notice served by the party's Disciplinary Action Committee (DAC), which he had received on the night of December 19th, he had tendered his resignation from the post of secretary general. "It is a very rare case that a high profile party officer bearer should fall under the DAC scanner as my integrity has become questionable. Therefore, I am taking this step so as to save the prestige and image of the party," he stated in the letter. He added, "It has been an honour to serve under your leadership for many years. I wish you good luck and God's blessing."

It may be mentioned that the two MPs of NPF, Kenye and Lok Sabha member from Outer Manipur Lorho S Ploze - had been directed to submit their replies within seven days from the date of issue of the show-cause notices, on or before December 26. The notices came after the party's Central Executive Council held a meeting on Thursday to deliberate on the actions to be taken against both the MPs for their conduct during the recent Winter Session of Parliament when the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill was passed. The duo had voted in favour of the Bill.

Kenye clarifies on voting
KG Kenye has clarified that he had voted in favour of the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2019 - CAB - as it granted exemption to Nagaland under provision of Inner Line Permit (ILP) under Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation (BEFR) 1873.

Addressing media persons, Kenye said he and his party (NPF) had strongly opposed CAB 2016 as the State was not granted exemption under ILP then and there was no reference to 6th Schedule of the Indian constitution or BEFR. However, he pointed out that CAB 2019 incorporated BEFR provision under "conditions and restrictions". (Cont'd on p-7)

J'khand last phase polling peaceful, 71.69 pc turnout

RANCHI, DEC 20 (PTI): The fifth and final phase of polling in 16 assembly constituencies of Jharkhand passed off peacefully on Friday and an estimated 71.69 per cent of the 40.05 lakh voters exercised their franchise, Election Commission officials said here. Out of 81 assembly seats in the states, elections concluded in 65 constituencies in the previous four phases - between November 30 and December 16. Counting has been scheduled on December 23.

Polls predict hung house
Jharkhand is headed for a hung assembly, according to IANS-Choice-AP Exit Poll for the 2019 Assembly Election.

According to the exit poll, JMM-Congress-RJD alliance is slated to get 35 seats in the 81-member house while BJP is expected to get 32. The range for the JMM-led alliance is expected to be somewhere between 31 to 39 seats while the BJP is expected to get 28 to 36 seats.

The BJP will find it difficult to form the government while the JMM-Congress alliance will have less work to reach the majority mark.

Centre yet to disclose details about Naga talks: Manipur CM

IMPHAL, DEC 20: Manipur chief minister N Biren Singh informed the Manipur Assembly on Friday that Government of India has not disclosed or communicated anything about the status of "Indo-Naga" peace talks.

The winter session, which commenced on December 18 and had only three sittings, concluded Friday with Assembly Speaker adjourning the house sine die.

During zero hour, opposition members urged the Speaker to extend the session for a day so the house could discuss the issue of "Indo-Naga" peace talk and adopt a fresh resolution for protection of unity and territory of the state.

Opposition member AK Mirabai of Congress said the discussion on the

issue was important considering the sentiment of the people of the state. The member said that there were apprehensions among the people that Centre has a willingness to create autonomous council in the Naga inhabited areas while inking the final peace accord with NSCN (IM).

She further pressed the leader of the house to table a detail report of the recent meeting between COCOMI delegation and Union home minister in which the state chief minister and some minister also took part from the state government side.

Another opposition member RK Imo of Congress also pressed the leader of the house (chief minister) to table a report on the latest status of the "Indo-Naga" peace talk.

In his reply, the chief minister N Biren Singh, who is also holding the

home portfolio, informed the house that till date the Centre government had not disclosed or communicated anything about the peace talk to the state government.

Singh further clarified that the Union home minister had made no official communication to the state government regarding the recent meeting between Union home minister and COCOMI leaders.

The chief minister reminded that the Assembly had already taken 12 resolutions for safeguarding the territorial integrity of the state.

He further informed the house that on the issue of border disputes between Manipur and Nagaland, there would have a joint meeting with a team of ministers from Nagaland and Manipur on December 21, 2019.

Decision, implementation of CAA with Centre: MHA

NEW DELHI, DEC 20 (IANS/AGENCIES): The decision whether to grant or not grant citizenship under the newly-enacted Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) will be taken by the Centre and the role of state officials will be minimal, top Home Ministry sources said on Friday.

The applications will be online so the role of the state government will be minimised, Home Ministry sources said. According to the sources, the Foreigner Regional Registration Officers (FRROs), in some cases are under central jurisdiction, but state resources will be utilised if the need arose.

According to the sources, all people will be in all-India NRC if they were born in India on or after January 26, 1950 but before July 1, 1987, and for those born in India on or after July 1, 1987 but before December 3, 2004, they will be in the NRC, if either parents was a

citizen of India at the time of their birth. For those born in India on or after December 3, 2004, they will be in the NRC if both parents are citizens of India or if one parent was a citizen of India and the other not an illegal migrant at the time of their birth.

Also for those born outside India on or after December 3, 2004, they will be in the NRC if one parent was citizen of India by birth at the time of their birth.

A person born outside India on or after December 3, 2004 shall not be a citizen of India, unless the parents declare that the minor does not hold passport of another country and his birth is registered in an Indian consulate within one year of birth.

Govt open to accept suggestions of protesters on CAA: Central government is open to accept suggestions, if any, from people who are staging protests

against CAA, a top official said on Friday. The Home Ministry is preparing the rules for the CAA in consultation with the Law Ministry that will indicate the process to apply for Indian citizenship by eligible refugees from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan under the legislation. The contentious Act suggests that the ministry will designate a competent authority that will handle the applications of those who are going to apply for Indian citizenship, and the entire process will be digital.

"No one will get Indian citizenship automatically. One has to prove eligibility," the official said. Documents required from applicants will be prescribed in the rules.

Indian citizens don't have to prove any ancestry: No Indian citizen will be unduly harassed or put to inconvenience by asking to prove citizenship by showing documents like birth certificates of parents or grandparents dating back to a period before 1971, Home Ministry said on Friday.

In a series of tweets, MHA spokesperson said will diliterate citizens not having any documents, will be allowed to produce witnesses or local proofs supported by members of community. "Citizenship of India may be proved by giving any document relating to date of birth or place of birth or both. Such a list is likely to include a lot of common documents to ensure that no Indian citizen is unduly harassed or put to inconvenience," the spokesperson said. A well laid-out procedure in this regard will be issued by the home ministry. "Indian citizens do not have to prove any ancestry by presenting documents like identity cards, birth certificates etc of parents/ grandparents dating back to pre-1971 situation," the spokesperson said.

ANCSU asks state govt to fulfil its demands

DIMAPUR, DEC 20 (NPN): All Nagaland College Students' Union (ANCSU) has reiterated appeal to the state government to look into the long-pending demands of the union without delay to avoid confrontation from the student community.

The demands of the union include land issue of Kohima Science College (KSC), Jotsoma and other district Colleges/Institutions, recruitment of 110 assistant professors through NPSFC and setting up of nodal cell for all scholarship schemes.

In a memorandum addressed to the chief minister and minister higher & technical education and tribal affairs, ANCSU president Vimeyickho Vitso and general secretary Imamnen N Jain pointed out that KSC land issue must be settled on priority since the college

was preparing to be assessed again in the next two to three years and was likely to be declared a deemed university. Also, questioning the state government for not bringing out any land survey report on other district college/institute, ANCSU has appealed to the state government to "comprehend the gravity of the land issues" and expedite the process.

Concerning setting up of nodal cell for all scholarship schemes, the union has acknowledged the state government for setting up a common scholarship portal and notifying the establishment for a nodal cell to implement all kinds of scholarship schemes. It has expressed hope that the nodal cell would be functional by early month of the year 2020. Also, acknowledging

the advertisement of 63 assistant professor posts by the Nagaland Public Service Commission (NPSFC), ANCSU has, however, urged the government to advertise the remaining 47 posts through NPSFC at the earliest. It affirmed that the sanctioned 110 assistant professor posts be recruited through NPSFC.

Meanwhile, ANCSU has proposed setting up of an academic council to facilitate growth of state's higher & technical education. It suggested that academic council should have representatives such as academicians, educationists, professors/associate professors/HoD from colleges within the state and other required members, who the department and the state government feel were genuine.
